



## The 2011 National Survey of State Mental Health Agencies Study Fact Sheet

### **Purpose of the study**

This survey is part of a larger study conducted by the Vocational Rehabilitation - Rehabilitation Research and Training Center (VR-RRTC) at the Institute for Community Inclusion (ICI) at the University of Massachusetts Boston (UMB). The Center is funded by the National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) and the Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA). We seek to collect data on the characteristics of state Mental Health (MH) agencies and how they work with other federal, state, and local agencies that provide services for people with disabilities. The findings will be used to develop state-by-state maps of interagency partnerships and public employment service delivery, highlighting the role of MH within this constellation.

### **Who else is participating?**

The survey is being sent to the MH agency Director in each state, as well as the District of Columbia, and the territories (American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands). Directors are asked to respond on behalf of their entire state / territory.

### **What will I be asked to do?**

You will be asked to complete a web-based survey questionnaire that contains four sections of questions about your state MH agency. Alternative formats of the survey are available and special needs accommodations will be made upon request.

### **Who should answer the questions?**

This survey should be completed by the Director of the state MH agency (or a designee).

### **How the data will be used?**

Data from the survey will be analyzed to provide critical information on key characteristics of state MH agencies and their respective programs. The findings will be used to develop state-by-state maps of interagency partnerships and public employment service delivery, highlighting the role of MH within this constellation. You will receive a copy of the final results.

### **Confidentiality**

Participation in the survey is voluntary – you may skip any question you do not wish to answer or that makes you feel uncomfortable. The survey is being sent to the MH agency director in each state – therefore each state will be identifiable in the final results. The answers you provide to these questions will not be kept confidential.
